COUNSELING TEAM UPDATE

KHS Families,

Here we are nearing the midpoint of the year. Soon our calendars will flip to 2020 and right around the corner we will be planning for next year at Keller High School. Our registration process will begin right after we return from winter break. The KHS Counselors will be at Keller Middle School and Indian Springs Middle School to help our incoming 8th graders get set up for success beginning the week of January 13, 2020. During that time we will also begin providing information to our current 9th-11th grade students related to registration. KHS students will make a rough draft during this week to help them with their course selections when they sit with their counselor in the subsequent weeks. We will pick classes with our current KHS students beginning on January 21, 2020 and will do this by grade over a three week period of time.

Once students have chosen their classes with their counselor, you as parents will have an opportunity to review those choices and assist your student in any adjustments through March 27, 2020. Now is a great time to begin reviewing plans with your student for next year. Information related to registration is housed on the KISD Counseling website. The course guide and registration sheets will be posted for next year's registration prior to winter break, so check back over the next couple of weeks.
