- > SHAC members were given the opportunity to provide feedback and ask questions of the District Leadership members.

V. Health Curriculum Voting

- Quorum was established with 11 total Board appointed SHAC members present. Eight parents and 3 District employees.
- > Votes were taken and tallied.
 - Results of voting as follows:
 - Question 1: Which option best describes your recommendation regarding health curriculum options for K-5 Health TEKS?
 - Majority vote: Option b I support a recommendation that KISD provides a health curriculum developed by District health teachers.
 - Question 2: Which option best describes your recommendation regarding health curriculum options for 6-12 Health TEKS?

- Majority vote: Option c I support both options, giving health teachers the flexibility to develop individual lesson plans and also utilize Goodheart-Willcox health curriculum.
- Question 3: Which option best describes your recommendation for the delivery of Health and Human Sexuality TEKS to students in 9-12?
 - Majority vote: Option a I recommend Big Decisions as an extension of the health, human sexuality curriculum for students in 9-12.
- Question 4: Which option best describes your recommendation regarding personal safety instruction (Jenna's Law/SB 9) to K-5 students?
 - Majority vote: Option c I support giving the elementary campuses the continued flexibility to choose between Alliance for Children and Play it Safe for personal safety instruction.
