

- Issues with the Student Information system used for the past 20 years (Powerschool)
 - Untimely technical support
 - Lack of software enhancements for better user experience and integrations with District applications
 - Slow process in student scheduling
 - Multiple issues with Home Access Center(HAC) for parents and students
 - Unresolved software issues docuented from the Texas
 Powerschool user group
 - Change in company ownership over the past several years; inconsistent support.



- Two major SIS in Texas for districts over 10,000 students
 - PowerSchool
 - Skyward
- Reviewed Skyward thoroughly
 - Non-SQL database with mature product- difficulty with integration to existing applications
 - Newer software has SQL database- poor recommendation from Districts using Skyward SQL version
- Aeries- Great reputation, flexible, willing to customize to fit Keller ISD. Reviewed for 2 years prior to selecting
