
This year, Keller ISD has hired over


Experience of Newly Hired Teacher, Librarians, and Nurses

Federal Title Allocations for KISD

- Title I = \$1,213,690.00
- Title IC = \$2, 562.00
- Title II = \$809,395.00
- Title III = \$403,879.00
- Title IV = \$230,193.00





- Title 1 is the largest federal aid program for public schools in the United States. This resource began in 1965 and continues to be reauthorized today. We receive funds based on the number of students who qualify for the free and reduced lunch program.
- We currently have 10 campuses identified as Title I school-wide campuses: Basswood, Bluebonnet, Caprock, Friendship, Heritage, North Riverside, Parkview, Whitley Road, Fossil Hill, and Vista Ridge.
- These campuses provide additional support and resources to students to help ensure that all educational needs are supported.
- Resources can include classroom materials, additional tutoring, additional direct instruction, transportation, and technology.



Title II

 Providing high-quality training and personalized professional development for teachers, instructional leadership teams and principals.





- Support high-quality and comprehensive educational programs for migratory children to help reduce the educational disruptions and other problems that result from repeated moves;
- Ensure that migratory children who move among the States are not penalized in any manner by disparities among the States in curriculum, graduation requirements, and State academic content and student academic achievement standards;
- We currently have two students identified for this program in Lone Star Elementary. We monitor their progress and provide services in collaboration with Region XI.





- The purpose of Title III is to ensure that English learners (ELs) and immigrant students attain English proficiency and develop high levels of academic achievement.
- Our ELs comprise 10.5% of the total Keller ISD student body.
- Over 63 languages are spoken by our Keller ISD families.

We provide:

- Dual Language Spanish/ English services at 10 campuses:
 Baswood, Caprock, Freedom (2-Way), North Riverside, ELC North and South, Whitley Road, Parkwood Hill, Trinity Meadows, and Fossil Hill.
- Late-exit transitional Vietnamese/ English bilingual services at 2 campuses: Parkview and Fossil Hill
- English as a Second Language (ESL) services are available to our ELs at all grade levels throughout all Keller ISD campuses.





Title IV

These funds are designed to improve the academic achievement of all students by increasing the capacity of LEA's, schools, and communities to:

- l) provide all students with access to a well-rounded education,
- 2) improve school conditions for student learning, and
- improve technology in order to enhance academic outcomes and digital literacy of students.
