# Development of Proposals

### DRESS AND GROOMING

The district's dress code is established to teach grooming and hygiene, prevent disruption, and minimize safety hazards. Principal discretion will be used in addressing any dress code issues which may adversely affect the educational atmosphere of the school.

All students are expected to adhere to common practices of modesty, cleanliness and neatness; to dress in a respectful manner within the acceptable standards of the community and in such a manner as to contribute to the academic atmosphere, not detract from it.

Students who

fail to comply with this dress code may be sent home and may be subject to disciplinary actions.

Students and parents may determine a student's personal dress and grooming standards, provided that they comply with the following:

- Students' hair shall be clean, neat, and well-groomed. Hair styles and color shall not, in the opinion of the administration, cause a health or safety hazard or cause a disruption of the educational process.
- 2. Students shall wear clothing and undergarments in keeping with their gender.

### Shirts/Tops

- No half-length, strapless, backless, halter, cut-off or bare-midriff shirts/blouses shall be worn.
- · No sheer or see-through garments will be permitted.
- Shirts must cover to the point of the shoulder.

- Shirts must have appropriate coverage of undergarments. Underarms and undergarments must be completely covered at all times.
- No cleavage shall be visible. Low cut blouses, tops, sweaters, etc. with plunging necklines are not allowed.

### Pants/Shorts

- Pants and shorts must be worn at the natural waistline. Belts must be worn if pants
  will not stay at the natural waistline. Exposure of undergarments is unacceptable.
- The minimum length of any garment, regardless of what it is called, must be no higher than 4 inches from the top of the knee.
- . Cut-outs or holes of any kind may not be above the top of the knee.
- Slits in skirts cannot be higher than 4 inches from the top of the knee.
- No cut-off shorts shall be worn.
- Form-fitting/skin tight pants, such as leggings, yoga pants, and tights, must be covered with a top/shorts reaching no higher than 4 inches above the top of the knee. Leggings/fights may not substitute as pants.
- Athletic shorts must follow dress code regulations except during athletic periods or activities as approved by coaches.

### Standardized Dress Code for All Levels

Elementary - 12<sup>th</sup> grade

<u>Rationale</u>: KISD wants to promote the safety and positive image of all its students in such a way that their personal appearance promotes the high standards of intentional exceptionality.

Apparel must be neat, clean, modest and worn appropriately. Clothing that is obviously inappropriate for school activities must not be worn and the decision of the principal will determine the appropriateness of the apparel.

Clothing, makeup, jewelry, patches, tattoos, or designs on clothing must not reflect or suggest in any manner drugs, alcohol, tobacco, sex, vulgar language, gang affiliation, violence, death or satanic ideology.

<u>Shirts</u>: must be collared with sleeves, polo or oxford styled, and must be solid colored. All shirts must be buttoned up to the collar bone.

- Logos must be manufactured logos
- · Jackets and sweaters are not considered shirts
- · Shirts can be any of the solid colors specified by each campus administration
- · Shirts must be tucked in with belt (solid, plain, black or brown with no designs)

<u>Pants:</u> Must be jeans or khaki pants of solid color (brown, blue or black). Shorts may also be worn, but must also be of solid color (brown, blue or black) and of appropriate length. Skirts/skorts and jumpers may also be worn and must be of a solid color (brown, blue, or black) and of appropriate length.

- · Pants or jeans must be free of rips, cuts, tears, and fraying
- Pants or jeans can have no more than 5 pockets (no cargo pants)
- Pants and jeans must be size appropriate to the student (no jeggings, leggings, spandex pants, baggy jeans/pants), so that they are neither too loose nor too tight
- . Shorts, skirts/skorts and jumpers must be no more than 4 inches above the knee
- No slits in skirts/skorts or jumpers
